## NAAC A PLUS – MAKING OF THE HISTORY

The quest for excellence by the MES College Marampally to mark a golden streak in the Higher Education of Kerala has materialized in its short span of existence. March 28, 2019 was a glorious day for the Institution to achieve NAAC A plus grade with CGPA 3.38 which is the first ever highest grade in the State as per the revised process of accreditation. The aspirational optimism and concerted effort of the Management, Staff, Parents, Alumni and Students brought this highest recognition to the institution. Every blade of grass and every grain of sand is proud to be a shareholder of MES

College Marampally. Realizing that the road to success is no a bed of roses, the sustained effort of the stakeholders to wade through the hazards and hurdles is exemplary to any Institution.

The preparation for the III Cycle NAAC accreditation was begun well in advance with the formation of Steering Committee for the seven criteria. Introduction of new format by the NAAC in March 2017 delayed the submission of SSR as the NAAC introduced revised accreditation framework. The new format of NAAC Comprised Qualitative and



Quantitative metric in SSR followed by Students Satisfaction Survey and Data Validation and Verification (DVV). The new format imposed a herculean task to the steering committee members and the meticulous preparation of SSR demanded more than 50 sittings with steering committee members. The IIQA (Institutional Information for Quality Assessment) was uploaded on 14 August, 2018 and the rain mayhem turned Kerala floods started from August 15. The IIQA was approved by the NAAC on 24 September and subsequently the SSR uploading in the NAAC portal initiated. Preparation of the students' database of past five years for the extended file information took its toll on TLE criteria members. The whole campus was working for the SSR preparation and the staff were networking each other to make the self-study report picture-perfect. The pain taken by the staff for the preparation of SSR is

commendable; majority of them remained in the campus till late night and some of them stayed in the college. The uploading of the data regarding the Curricular Aspects started on 29 October 2018 and remaining criteria in subsequent days. The final submission of the SSR has been finished on 13 November 2018. The Students Satisfaction Survey initiated immediately after SSR Submission and 15.773% of the students participated in the survey. The DVV process opened on 29 November 2018 and successfully responded on 13 December 2018.

The commitment of the Management committee to transform the infrastructure is commendable apart from their role as the guiding force in administration. The facelift of the entrance, Walkways, Cooperative store, CCTV surveillance, Administrative space, South Block, Health Club are some of the additions in the post accreditation period.

The progressive vision of the College Management was instrumental the growth of the institution.

### NAAC Visit

The most awaited Peer team visit was on March 13 and 14, 2019. The Peer team members for the NAAC visit was Prof. (Dr.) V. Gopal Reddy Vangala, former Vice Chancellor, Kakkatiya University, (Chairperson), Prof. (Dr.) Vijay Fulari, Head, Department of Physics, Shivaji University, (Member Coordinator) and Prof. (Dr.) Lawrence Amal Raj, former Principal, Loyola College, Chennai (Member). 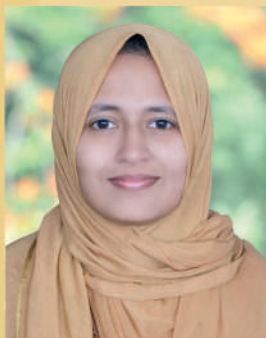

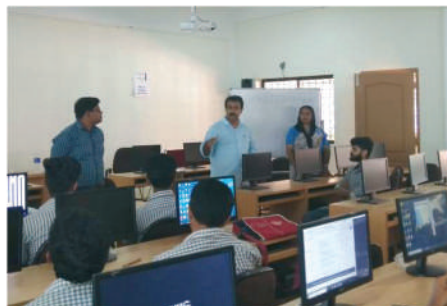


## Association Inauguration

On the first day he explains about general information about the java programming language, the need for Android App development, Installation and android development kit and the basic files in the android. In the succeeding sessions, students learnt how to develop simple android applications. The first app developed by students is to display a simple message. From this they are familiar with how to create an app, and run the app. After that they had developed some more simple apps which helps them to understand the basic idea behind android app development.

## JOB TRAINING PROGRAM

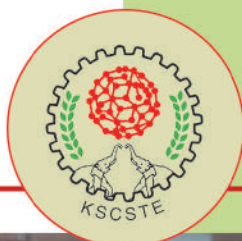

The students are also invited to various activities organized by the college and they are getting special coaching for sports events from Physical Education department. The Department of Business Administration also conducted a five days workshop under the Corporate Connect Forum for students of STD 6.





# FLOOD RELIEF CAMP



The surroundings of the college was one of the most affected areas by the flood. When the shutters of the Idukki dam was opened on the first week of august, the college chosen as the camp for those people living on either sides of the Periyar river. The College auditorium opened its doors for the victims and transportation was arranged in the college buses. The camp lasted only a few days as the flood was short-lived. The camp was reopened on 15<sup>th</sup> August, when the water level in Periyar advanced due to extremely heavy rain fall again. The NSS, NCC, Emergency Response Team and the REDCROSS club of the college were always at hand for any assistance. As the flood spread more, more number of people turned up in to the camp. On 15th august representatives

representatives of MES College for Advanced Studies, Edathala turned up with rations for the flood affected. By evening, MES Ernakulam District President Mr. Zakeer Hussain visited the camp for looking after the smooth functioning. As more people were rehabilitated, the AIMAT block and BCA block was opened up for the victims. Special care was given to pregnant women, disabled and the diseased. The canteen service was also extended for cooking and serving food. By august 16th, almost 4000 people had turned up in the camp out of which 350 were the labourers from other states. The NCC, NSS, RED CROSS, CERT, Alumni association of the college supported the camp effectively and the police department and the government

authorities coordinated the smooth functioning of the camp. A medical team with three doctors was present in the camp for medical assistance and a counselling team was also summoned for providing mental support to the victims. On the last day of the camp, an orientation class was given to the victims by the social worker, Venu Variath on the steps to be taken, once they get back to their flood affected homes. The victims were also provided with a ration kit with food clothings and cleaning tools. Many political leaders, socialists and higher officials visited the camp and opined that MES College Marampally was the best functioning camp in Ernakulam. This was the result of the perfect coordination between the Management, students, staff and alumni of the college.





Chendamangalam, a hand loom village in the Ernakulam district was severely affected by the flood. As part of the survival, an innovative idea was proposed by Ms. Lakshmi Menon, a designer along with Mr. Gopinath Parayil, founder of a travel company, a project called 'Chekutty'. In Malayalam the word 'cheru' means dirt and kutty means child; therefore 'Chekutty' is the child who overcome the dirt in Chendamangalam. This handmade doll, fashioned out of sullied or flood affected fabric of the hand loom textiles, symbolises hope and unity. The founder and the co-workers started up by building the Chekutty dolls from the damaged sarees and dhotis which in turn helped to makeup the losses faced by the weavers.

To build up together, the Bioscience Department has joined its hands and started an initiative to help the Chendamangalam weavers. They went to the *Kalamkari* boutique at Panampilly and learn the chekutty making flood trapped hand weaved sarees and threads of Chendamangalam. The students quickly grasped the method and helped them to make a few. After getting the materials the students cordially made about 250 chekutty dolls. The dolls were then given back to the owners for sale.

In the process, we realised that each chekutty was not just a doll, but a symbolization of valour of mankind that survived the flood and it surely has sewed the hope of survival of humanity in the world.

## REHABILITATION ACTIVITIES

The cleaning of the flood affected houses was a tedious task and a team was set up from the college, that included teaching, non-teaching staffs and students. The required resources like water guns, mops, cleaning liquids, wipers and other amenities were provided by the management. This team prepared a schedule as per which they were divided into smaller teams and each team went to different areas and assisted in the cleaning process.

After lending the helping hands to the most deserved, the team had prioritized the cleaning of the houses of students and staffs of the college. The team was equipped with all the resources required for cleaning and helped the people to come back to normalcy at the earliest. The team then assisted in the cleaning of about 30 houses, Marampally Mosque, Community hall, Vazhakkulam Panchayat building, temple, libraries etc. Office staffs Mr. Majeed, Mr. Noushad, Mr. Jamal and Mr. Abdul Rahman deserves a special mention for coordinating and leading the entire work in the field. They worked tirelessly from morning to night and would stop only after the normal life had ensued for the total inhabitants.

The management decided to help the victims further by providing free uniforms, books etc. A total of 444 students were identified, and the management provided uniforms, notebooks, ID tags, records and textbooks etc. Besides these the academic and household needs of the victims were also met by providing books, rice, groceries, dress, napkins, slippers, dresses etc. for the flood affected students.



## FREE WATER QUALITY ANALYSIS

As part of the flood relief assistance and activities, MES College, Marampally, offered water quality analysis free of cost to the public. Three hundred water samples were tested in the water testing laboratory (Kerala Pollution control Board accredited) working under the Department of Biosciences, MES College, Marampally free of cost which included water sources such as wells of various houses, hotels, institutions such as schools, various industries etc. Most of the water samples were contaminated by storm generated discharges and overflows, septic tank collapse or leakage and sewerage over flows.

Parameters such as pH, turbidity, total plate count, presence of faecal coliforms and E. coli were tested. Out of the total samples approximately 98% were contaminated with high levels of faecal coliforms and E. coli was present in approximately which indicated faecal contamination. Necessary advice regarding the measures to be taken to improve the sanitary quality of the drinking water sources was given. Presently we are in the second phase of water quality analysis as we are now analysing the samples from wells which are treated by chlorination or other suitable methods several times. These treatments are found effective and the positive outcome observed is that, the water samples that we receive now are reported to contain lesser levels of total microbial contamination as well as faecal coliforms and E. coli; indicating significant improvement in the sanitary quality of the water sources.





## KERALA FLOOD 2018



### KUTTANADU CLEANING DRIVE

In the first stage itself Kuttanad was witnessing a massive flash flood. M E S College Marampally in association with NCC, NSS and Department of Vocational Studies collected an amount of Rs. 25000/- from students and decided to donate the amount to flood relief activities. In the mean time we came to know about the venture and understood the importance of the task at the current state of affairs and decided to include Ernakulam district Committee to be a part of it. Under the leadership of District committee about Rs.2,00,000/- were collected from various MES institutions. This marked the beginning of the glorious flood relief activities performed by Muslim Educational Society.

Remaining activities were organized with the help of Alappuzha District Committee. President Dr. Firoz, informed Dr. Fazal Gafoor, MES State President about the mission and he decided to coordinate the program in the state level. State Secretary Sri. P.O.J. Labba has decided to allocate state committees contribution into the relief fund. Motivated by this, Alappuzha district Committee has also raised an amount.

In the next day along with State secretary MES, Ernakulam District Secretary M.M. Ashraf, leaders such as Hamsakkoya, Asees, Dr. Firoz, Shefeeq, Rasheed, Hakkim, Salim, Razaq, Shanavas, Shahul Hameed, Dr. A Biju were visited PWD minister G.Sudhakaran at Collectorate, Alappuzha. Honourable minister Sri. G Sudhakaran appointed the Collectorate officials to arrange background facilities for the mission.

About 400 kits including clothes, cleaning materials, sanitary napkins, medicines, stationery etc. were distributed. On August 7 under the leadership of Sri. Jabbar Jalal, Youth wing State President and Lt.Ibrahim Salim, NCC Officer, MES College Marampally, a group representing Ernakulam District Committee reached Alappuzha. Under the leadership of Ambalapuzha Taluk Secretary Jb. Hakim, District President Dr.Firoz Muhammed a team of 14 members started in a boat to Kuttanad with flood relief kit along with them. The revenue officials Sri Riyas, Sri.Santhosh appointed by Collector also accompanied the team. They started at morning 8.30 from Rajiv Gandhi Jetty.

## GENDER/ DISCRIMINATION/ EMPOWERMENT AND CYBER CRIMES AND LAW



Internal Complaints Committee organized an awareness programme for final year degree students on 10 January, 2019. Resource persons were Mr. Thalath P.M, Civil Police Officer, Cyber Cell, Aluva, Harikrishnan M, Project Officer, Kerala State Women Development Corporation and Abdul Jamal, SI of Police, Binanipuram. 150 students participated in the sessions. The theme was based on cyber-crimes and law awareness class and Gender/ Discrimination/ Empowerment. Students were detailed about various cyber related pitfalls from multiple social media apps like WhatsApp, Facebook and Google. Various reports on how youngsters and adults were affected were shown through Power point presentations to capture maximum attention. Security issues about mobile
