
# MES COLLEGE MARAMPALLY Anti-Drug Cell Report: 2021-22


### Observance of International Day against Illicit Drug & Trafficking




The disciplinary and legal aspect of the substance abuse was explained by Mr. A. B. Vipin (Inspector of Police, Crime Branch, Kerala).



















## **Awareness Programme**

The Anti-Drug Cell & ICC along with Department of Psychology in collaboration with staff association, jointly organized an awareness program on the topic "Drug an ugly truth " on 12th February 2022 at 11 am. The program started with a silent prayer. Mr. A B Vibin, Circle Inspector of Police, Meppady Police Station was the resource person. The session was made interactive and he covered major topics related to increased drug usage in the society and the methods to prevent it. He said that high school students and college students are influenced by

social pressure and more likely to involve in risky behaviour than other age groups. Using drugs or alcohol at a young age before the brain development can create a lot of emotional, physical, social, behavioral and interpersonal issues, however. Abuse of alcohol and drugs by high school and college student may present unique circumstances wherein specialized treatment methods are ideal to foster a healthy life style for a long term recovery, informs Mr. A B Vibin, CI.
